

To People of the United States,

WE, the undersigned, have closely read the supplemental information to the Report of Investigation dated August 30, 2011 in the above referenced cases. We do not find any new or relevant information provided by Secretary of the Air Force/Office of the General Counsel (SAF/GCA). We continue to disagree with the findings and stand by our previous testimony and rebuttal letters. It is noteworthy that SAF/GCA continues to disregard any of the ethical objections raised by us.

Furthermore, it is significant that SAF/GCA have deemed it necessary to reveal whistleblower names that can have the response of chilling all future whistleblowers. They have justified this because we consented to the release of our names. However, since the Deputy General Counsel (Fiscal, Ethics and Administrative Law) formalized the SAF/GCA's supplement it all must be perfectly ethical.

There have been many changes and improvements to the processes and personnel at Air Force Mortuary Affairs Operations. We wholeheartedly welcome and fully support our chain of command. We look forward to continued process improvements and open environment.
